

Post 16 Money Workshops (100 minutes)

Our **Post 16 Money Workshops** are aimed at college and sixth form students aged 16 – 19. They are delivered by our trained and experienced workshop consultants in schools and colleges across the UK.

The workshops are delivered to students at a pivotal time on their road to financial independence and helps prepare students the next stages in their lives.

We offer two standard 100 minute long workshops for Post 16 students; these are the Post 16 1 and 2 money workshops. We also offer two 60 minute workshops for further information please see “Post 16 Money Workshops (100 minutes)” for further details.

Post 16X Money Workshop

Our **Post 161 Money Workshop** is aimed at college and sixth form students that are planning on going to university. It covers -

- Planning ahead for the next stages of your life – mainly university;
- Saving– understanding how an ISA works;
- How to maintain a good credit rating; and how to use APR
- Understanding financial products, including insurance;
- Student finance and managing money at uni.



Post 16Y Money Workshop

Our **Post 162 Money Workshop** covers all of the same content as the *Post 16a* but with a focus on living independently after sixth form and college. It focuses on the cost of living and the new things you need to consider when living by yourself for the first time, like paying bills.

The workshop includes a range of activities, a chance to debate and discuss, and relevant takeaways for the students. The Post 16 Money workshop is an essential way to improve students' confidence and skills in managing their finances.

Our evaluation data is externally managed and collected before and after each of our workshops to allow us to effectively measure the impact of workshops on student's skills, knowledge and confidence related to managing money.

Our feedback shows:

- Before the workshop, 63% of students agreed to some level that they found the thought of taking out a student loan daunting. This dropped dramatically after the workshop, with the majority (58%) switching to saying they didn't find it daunting.
- Before the workshop 75% of students were unsure or didn't have a clue what APR stood for. After the presentation 61% were confident they knew what it stood for.
- Before the workshop only 36% of students were confident they could create a budget. After the workshop this rose to 68%.
