I live with my parents and pay them £8 in rent per day. I hate cleaning up so my parents do this for me but I have to pay them £6 per day!

I usually go into school early each day for the revision classes and because the breakfast they serve is really nice and only costs £2.50! I live about a half-hour walk from the bus stop, so I get my brother to give me a lift each morning as my school isn't too far from where he works.

I need some new trainers for PE. I have to buy them from the school office so they are in line with the school uniform policy. They cost £15.

I am really good and bring a packed lunch most days, as lunch can be expensive at school. On Fridays I treat myself because the school serves fish and chips, which is yum. This costs £5.50.

On Wednesday this week, I am going to the cinema. I will pay £3 for a return ticket on the bus into town to meet my friends. We are going to see the new Disney film. I am really excited! Tickets will be £7.50 plus I will get some popcorn for £4.

After school I usually chill out by watching my favourite shows on Netprime for a couple of hours. Netprime costs me £5 per week.

I then message my friends until bedtime. My parents moan at me for always being on my phone. I have to top up £20 once a week but it's worth it; I've got to keep up to date with all the gossip!

I want a new games console so each week I try to put £50 into my savings account.
