You like to be energy efficient so spend about £90 per month on gas, electric and water.



You are a self-employed electrician working in Birmingham.

You are a zoo keeper working in Chester Zoo. Your annual salary is £17,000.



You went to university and took out a student loan but are not currently earning enough to have to pay it back.


You are a basic-rate tax payer so you pay 20% tax on some of your income. Therefore, your take-home (net) income is £1,306 per month.
