



Post 16 Money Workshops

Our **Free Post 16 Money Workshops** are aimed at secondary school students aged 16 – 18. They are delivered by our externally trained workshop consultants.

Our workshops provide the building blocks to sound money management, and include a range of activities, the chance to debate and discuss, and relevant takeaways for the students.

For Key Stage 16 we offer two, two hour long programme, one for those planning to go to university and one for those wanting to go straight into work. These programmes can split to best suit the needs of your school. Most school we work with have 2x1 hour sessions spread across the academic year as part of Tutor time, Citizenship or Maths lessons. We pride ourselves on providing high quality support to schools by ensuring our workshops fit into school timetables and requirements.

We understand that teachers require engaging, flexible and time efficient ways to deliver financial education to their students so all are sessions can be delivered as standalone hour long workshops too.

Feedback

Our evaluation data is externally managed and collected before and after each of our workshops to allow us to effectively measure the impact of workshops on student's skills, knowledge and confidence related to managing money.

In terms of skills gained after the workshop, our data shows:

- By the end of the workshop over 80% of student felt more confident in explaining what a maintenance loan.
- 85% of students had improved their knowledge on what they needed to spend their money on to survive.
- 97% of Post 16 students felt that they had learnt something new

Our Workshops

Post 16a Money Workshop

The first hour of our workshop aimed at college and sixth form students that are planning on going to university covers -

- Planning ahead for the next stages of your life – mainly university;
- Student finance and managing money at uni



Post 16b Money Workshop

The first hour of our workshop aimed at students not planning to go to university covers –

- Planning ahead for the next stages of your life – Moving out, getting a job
- Cost of living and the new things you need to consider when living by yourself for the first time.



Post 16c Money Workshop

Our third hour is the same for all students. It helps them understand how to use different financial products to achieve their goals. It covers-

- Saving
- How to maintain a good credit rating; and how to use APR
- Understanding bank statements and including insurance.

In 2016 we delivered 1,026 workshops to over 23,000 students across England, Wales and Northern Ireland.
